Here is the latest news from our Japan Correspondent (Brian Chandler):

Kobayashi Koichi carried on his Honinbo challenge against Cho Chikun by winning the first three games of the 7-game match. Then Cho performed a classic fight-back, winning the last four straight, and reclaiming his title on 23rd July.
 Kobayashi Koichi now leads Kobayashi Satoru (no relation) 2-1 in the Gosei title. Otake narrowly held on to the top of the Meijin league, so he will challenge Kobayashi (Koichi) the current holder.
 Nie Wei-ping, the Chinese "Tianyuan" beat Rin Kai-ho the Japanese "Tengen" 2-0 in one of the matches between corresponding title holders. The two names have the same Chinese characters, meaning Heaven Point.
 A young pro to look out for is 5-dan Ryu Shi-kun, originally from Seoul. When 4-dan (in June), he managed to win the "Outsiders' ladder" in the Kisei tournament, which involved beating all the others from 3 to 7-dan. He also recently beat Ogata 8-dan in the NHK tournament.

WORLD AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP:

Forty representatives from around the world fought for the World Amateur title from the 27th to the 30th of May. The final winner was the veteran of the Japanese amateur Go scene Kikuchi Yasuro, who scraped past the Chinese and South Korean representatives on SOS. Laurent Heiser from Luxembourg managed fourth place, and Matthew Macfadyen a very creditable fifth. This is the first time that Kikuchi has captured the title, and at 62 he was the oldest competitor! --Brian Chandler
